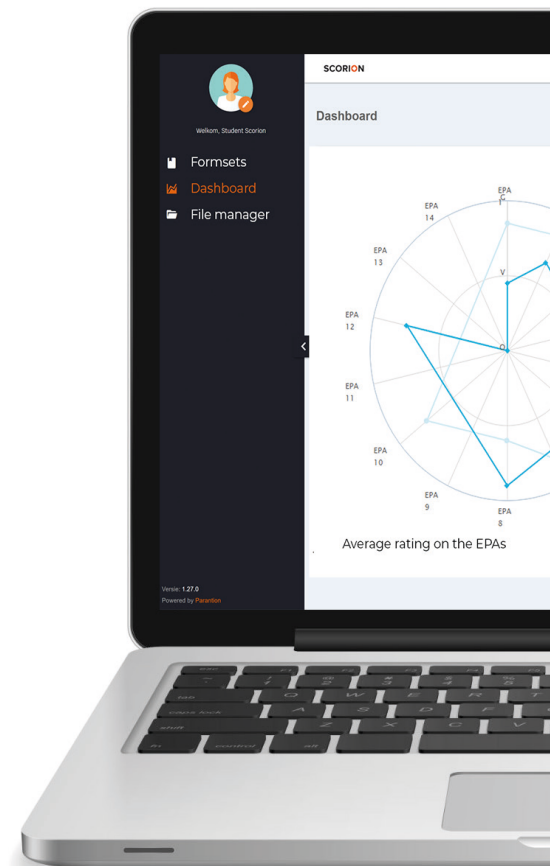
The e-portfolio for the next generation

Scorion is an e-portfolio for workplace learning and Programmatic Assessment. Students complete all kind of assessment and feedback forms digitally in the blink of an eye. And can see how they are progressing at any time on well-structured dashboards. Educational institutions finally get a real-time insight into the progress students are making:

They educate proven competent students.

The Scorion e-portfolio is the first data-driven portfolio for Programmatic Assessment. The system supports a new kind of learning development: students and professionals record their activities continuously and not just at the end of a period. They reflect on their own learning progress and complete feedback and all kinds of assessments easily via their smartphone or tablet. Clear dashboards provide insights into their own progress. All these insights support students and professionals to continuously develop in their profession.

With over 20 different types of assessment and feedback, almost any (practical) activity can be integrated as a form in Scorion. For example, forms can be created using the OSCE module or the 360-degree feedback module. Therefore, all learning moments that are relevant for the professional development of students can be included and recorded in Scorion.

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Competent students and professionals through Programmatic Assessment

Programmatic Assessment describes an educational concept in which as many assessment and learning activities as possible are collected in the form of data points. With the help of all these learning moments, a solid basis for evaluation and feedback is created. The origin of Programmatic Assessment is that a single grade or assessment cannot tell enough about how learners are actually developing.

Because students and professionals ultimately learn a wide variety of skills and competencies during their study programme, which cannot be summed up in a single assessment. The idea of Programmatic Assessment originally came from Prof. Dr. Cees van der Vleuten (Maastricht University).

Today, the concept has become fully established, especially in academic and vocational teaching in the Netherlands. However, the concept is also becoming increasingly important in other countries, such as Germany, Australia or even South Africa and in some Asian countries. Many educational institutions that have implemented Programmatic Assessment, work with Scorion. This is because every practical activity can be made measurable with the help of fully customizable forms. Programmatic Assessment is not only seen as key to the feedback culture, but also helps to actually train competent students and professionals.





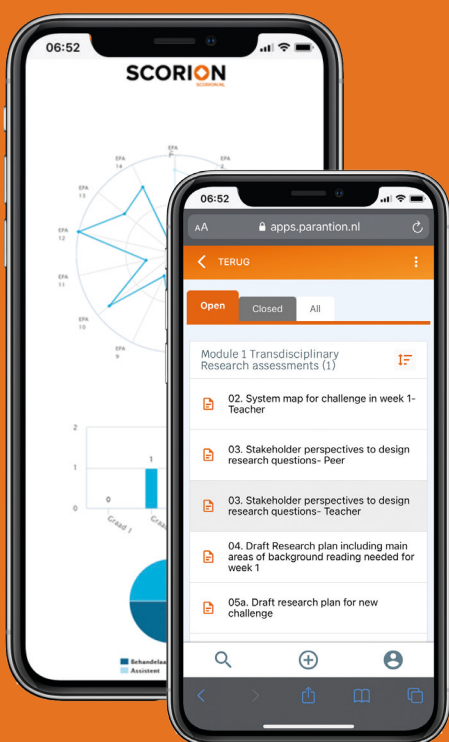
Scorion is more than just a tool

The implementation of Scorion is not just purchasing a new tool: It means much more an improvement of education. This often results in joint projects between the educational institutions and Parantion.

Together with the educational institution, the Scorion team examines how the system can best be integrated into the curriculum. In order to plan this process as well as possible, a flow chart was created, which consists of 13 different steps.

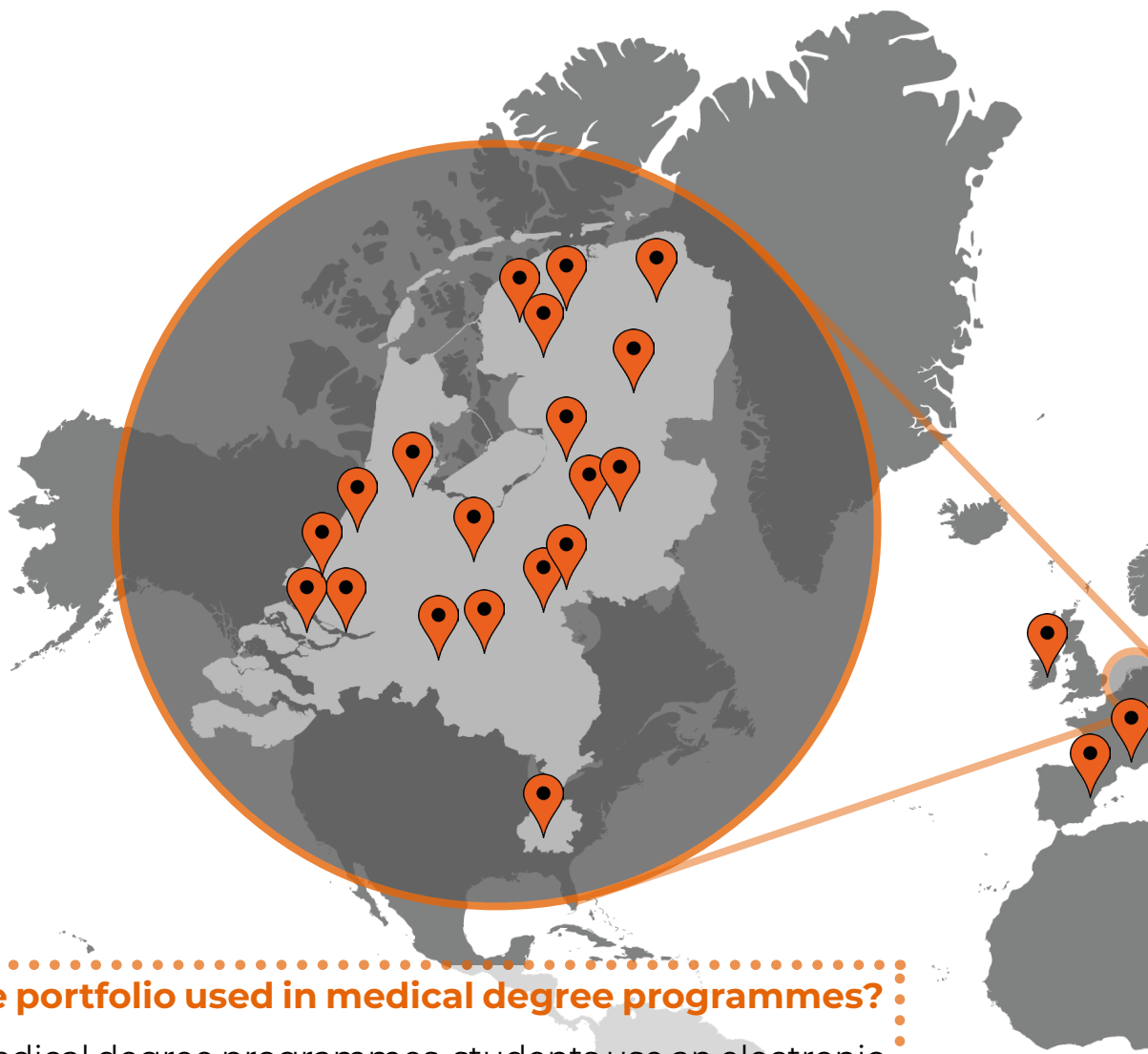

How is the portfolio used in medical degree programmes?

In many medical degree programmes, students use an electronic portfolio during their practical phases to prove their competences and to ensure a successful theory-practice transfer.

By completing digital assessments, students can prove the competences they have learned. They reflect on themselves and receive continuous feedback from their supervisors. The portfolio also serves as a documentation tool for proof of hours and supervision. All relevant data are thus recorded and evaluated in the portfolio. The portfolio is therefore often used in combination with a Programmatic Assessment approach.

The collected data is then presented on dashboards so that the development of the students can be viewed at any time. The external supervisors are given access to the documents relevant to them, so they can validate and return them to the students.



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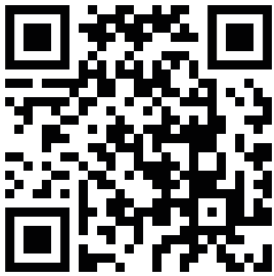
