KCU's New College of Dental Medicine

Kansas City University (KCU) is making a big move to help with the shortage of dentists in four states with its newly established College of Dental Medicine. In a region spanning 125 miles from Joplin, Missouri, this initiative aims to bring comprehensive dental care to underserved communities.

KCU's groundbreaking project commenced in May 2021, with the first cohort of 80 students set to begin in 2023, eventually growing to 320 students over the 4 year program. The College's team-based, comprehensive care model intends to meet the urgent need for dentists, particularly in rural areas.

Central to this effort is the state-of-the-art Oral Health Center, which provides practical training opportunities for students while offering much-needed care to the public. With its modern design and patient-friendly layout, the Center reflects KCU's commitment to accessible healthcare.

Transforming Vision into Portfolio: KCU's Collaboration with Scorion

Scorion joined forces with Kansas City University (KCU) in March 2022 for a practical mission. Together, we aimed to create a unique portfolio tailored to Clinical Skills Assessments and Competency-based Assessments, reshaping the learning landscape. The collaboration between Scorion and KCU demonstrates professionalism and teamwork.

At the core of this effort was an interactive dashboard that captures assessment data in real-time. This tool empowers both KCU and its students to track and visualize their progress, ensuring competency progression and mastery.

The portfolio includes 34 rubric forms, featuring precise point calculations and insightful pass or fail recommendations. The main dashboard offers an overview of assessment levels for each rubric, categorized as pass or fail outcomes.

Further enhancing the experience, Scorion and KCU jointly designed individual rubric dashboards. This feature allows easy navigation from the main dashboard to any of the 34 rubric-specific pages. Each rubric dashboard displays a line graph to track progress over time, along with valuable narrative feedback.

"Over the last year, we launched our first project on American soil with Scorion. A project like this in a completely different country is always a huge milestone. I still remember our first projects in Germany and South Africa.

No matter what challenges you face, both sides work hard to overcome them and deliver a high-quality project.

For the project in the United States, we worked with Kansas City University to create a portfolio for a dental degree program. But the story behind it also makes the project very special to me: because Kansas City University has established a new College Of Dental Medicine to address the shortage of dentists in four American states. In a region that spans 125 miles from Joplin, Missouri, this initiative aims to provide comprehensive dental care to rural areas.

The Scorion portfolio will be made available to approximately 80 new students. Essentially, it will be used for clinical skills assessments and competency-based evaluations. This information is displayed in real-time on a dashboard, allowing both the students and the university itself to track their learning progress and maintain their competence.

As I sit back and reflect on the past few months, something strikes me – it's not just about reaching the finish line. It's about the entire wild ride of a first project, full of twists and turns. That's what makes this project unquestionably one for the books!"
